

Reviewer's comment:-

1. It is significant as an introductory overview of attachment theory and how the social work field has used the theory.
2. The title is descriptive of the work and the abstract is comprehensive.
3. The writing and grammatical style is excellent. The ideas are expressed clearly and flow well. There are some passive phrases use. Try to use active voice primarily.
4. The introduction provides a good foundation. The Origins is a strong section showing the development of attachment theory. The section on the contributions of social work could be stronger by providing more examples of how attachment theory is applied in practice. Principles of attachment and Reactive Attachment Disorder sections are well-defined. The Evidence section is good. However, this may be a place to expand on the neurobiology as a demonstration of evidence. The conclusion could be strengthened by addressing the limitations of the theory and stating what further research is needed.
5. The references are excellent. In my download copy, there are some indention issues but that could be the result of downloading.

You cite 2 articles by Flaherty but are missing the Flaherty et al. 2011 reference.

You have 2 references by Schneider but only the 1991 is cited.

You list Siegal in the reference but there's no citation.

6. Correct references and citations; remove passive voice; strengthen conclusion and social work contribution.
