

Reviewer's comment-1

Thank you very much for the opportunity to review this manuscript. There are inaccuracies in the presentation of foundational concepts. For example, B. F. Skinner is described as “having studied ABA,” when he is more accurately recognized as the father of operant conditioning and a key figure in the development of applied behavior analysis. In another example, the author described functional analyses as, “the go-to clinical methods to understand why problem behaviors occur,” without providing context as to the profession or environment (e.g., a school psychologist rarely conducts an FA because an FBA is more in line with their training, is fairly reliable, and is easier to do; counselors aren’t doing FAs in their offices). Throughout the manuscript, there is also a noticeable lack of citations to support key claims, which undermines the scholarly rigor of the paper.
