

Review comment -1

This manuscript addresses an important and timely public health issue. Polysubstance use is increasingly recognized as a critical factor in overdose risk, yet there is limited research focusing specifically on the Latinx community and the sociocultural dynamics that shape such behaviors. The study contributes to the literature by offering an in-depth qualitative perspective, highlighting lived experiences that are often underrepresented. This work is valuable for researchers, clinicians, and policymakers seeking culturally responsive interventions.

The title is generally appropriate and reflects the focus of the study. However, there is a minor typographical error (“ACOMMUNITY” should be “A COMMUNITY”).

The abstract is generally comprehensive and clearly outlines the purpose, methodology, and key findings. Consider briefly mentioning that the study is based on a single participant case study for transparency and clarify the implications more explicitly (e.g., policy, clinical practice).

Specific Comments:

- Correct typographical and formatting errors throughout the manuscript-especially the title.
- Clarify ethical approval/IRB exemption status.
- Slightly strengthen the abstract by emphasizing the single-case design and implications.
