The manuscript is highly relevant to the fields of social work, social welfare policy, and child protection policies aimed at preventing maltreatment, ensuring safety, and promoting the well-being of children by strengthening families. It makes an important contribution by examining the evolution of media representations of child maltreatment and analyzing how media coverage influences public perceptions of this issue, both before and after the implementation of related policies. However, the manuscript would benefit from thorough editing, particularly in the introductory section and the main body of the article.

The Introduction section of the manuscript should be condensed to approximately 10% of the overall document length. To strengthen the article, the inclusion of a Literature Review section would be advantageous. Additionally, the methodology requires clarification, as it is unclear whether the approach is quantitative, qualitative, or mixed methods. It is advisable for the authors to refrain from using first-person pronouns in their writing. In the context of developing a research project, terms such as "I," "we," "my," or "our" should be omitted. This practice helps to maintain objectivity and formality in the work. Furthermore, certain paragraphs necessitate condensation. In academic publications, paragraphs typically range from 100 to 200 words (approximately 3 to 8 sentences) and represent the standard unit for articulating a single, well-developed idea.
