Suggested Experimental Classroom Activities and Assignments" sections, it is imperative to convert the bullet points into narrative format. An excessive use of bullet points can dilute their intended impact, resulting in a document that may appear cluttered and unprofessional. To remedy this issue, one should consider rewriting the content into complete paragraphs, transforming lengthy bulleted lists into tables, or developing separate, more focused bulleted lists. This approach will significantly improve the overall readability and presentation of the material.

Corrections

The bullet points in the "Suggested Experimental Classroom Activities and Assignments," section were removed and converted into a narrative format as complete paragraphs. Two tables were added to improve the readability and presentation of the material.

Reviewer Comments

The article should include additional references. It is best practice for a research paper to ground every paragraph in the relevant and current literature by including several references.

Corrections

Additional references were added with a total of twenty-two listed on the reference page.
